




COMMITMENT

Through realistic and effective training & strengthening diplomatic ties

Some examples of exercises and fora:

➤ Defence Cyber Marvel (DCM4) - Multilateral Cyber Defence Exercise



24-28 Feb 2025: More than 1,000 personnel from 27 nations took part in a defence exercise which simulated cyber attacks.

➤ Singapore hosts 23rd FPDA Defence Chiefs' Conference



29 May 2025: Defence Ministers pledge to build trust and interoperability among the militaries of member countries.

➤ Exercise Tiger Balm 2025



5-16 May 2025: The longest-running bilateral exercise between Singapore and the USA - during which soldiers ran through combat exercises and other drills, including urban warfare drills in SAFTI City.

➤ Exercise Griffin Cakti with Indonesian National Defence Forces (TNI)



2-4 June 2025: The bilateral Counter-Terrorism Field Training Exercise comprised elements from naval, air, cyber and special operations units.

COMMITMENT

Respond readily and effectively when called upon to protect Singapore's interests and the people of Singapore

Some examples of operational readiness:

➤ **RSAF scrambles two F-16s after Malaysian copter flies near Changi Airport: 20 flights delayed**



9 Aug 2024: After ensuring that our security was not compromised, the F-16s were subsequently stood down.

➤ **RSN leverages technology to respond to wide range of threats**



21 Nov 2024: RSN ready to respond to a wide range of traditional and non-traditional threats, keeping in line with the evolving nature of conflicts.

➤ **SAF exercises Ops Readiness across all Services**



27 May 2025: Minister for Defence Mr Chan Chun Sing visited high readiness units from Army, RSN & DIS, and RSAF's Ex Rover to observe their routine readiness training.

COMMITMENT

Through contributing to peace support operations and humanitarian assistance and disaster relief (HADR) missions

Some examples of MINDEF/SAF peace support operations & HADR missions:

- **Airlift support to deliver aid supplies to communities affected by Tropical Storm Kristine**



26 Oct 2024: RSAF C-130 deployed to Philippines to aid humanitarian efforts after Tropical Storm Trami.

- **Providing humanitarian aid to Myanmar earthquake victims**



2 April 2025: RSAF deployed two C-130 transport aircrafts to deliver over 9 tonnes of humanitarian aid supplies to Myanmar.

- **Supporting flood relief efforts in Australia**



6 Feb 2025: SAF provided relief to civilians affected by the flood by supplying transport personnel and emergency supplies.

- **Deploying a Medical Contingent to Egypt in Support of Gaza Relief Efforts**



16 April 2025: SAF and MOH deployed a contingent to provide medical care to Palestinians and other civilians from Gaza who were being treated in Egypt.



Investments in the SAF's Training Infrastructure

SAFTI City [Phase 1]

Since Oct 2024, SAFTI City Phase 1 has been available to train battalions in urban operations and homeland security.

- Realistic and challenging urban training environment.
- Features include:
 - High-rise, interconnected buildings
 - Multi-storey carpark
 - Bus interchange
 - MRT station
 - Urban rubble for disaster relief training





Pulau Tekong will be expanded 10km in distance to serve as The Singapore Army's second manoeuvre training area for soldiers, as well as combat vehicles, as the Army becomes increasingly platform-based.

INCREASED TRAINING SPACE

- Enhances manoeuvre training realism involving both troops and combat vehicles
- Larger land space supports multi-domain operations that integrate land, air, cyber, and electronic warfare elements
- Supports more advanced, platform-based systems such as armoured vehicles, unmanned systems, and integrated sensor-shooter networks.

Through Total Defence (TD)

A strong SAF contributes towards Military Defence

It also supports the other pillars of Total Defence by responding to crises, safeguarding critical infrastructure, and partnering with the community to enhance national resilience.



From 25 Sep to 2 Oct 2024, over 500 polytechnic students engaged in **hands-on TD activities**, launched the **SAFRA 'I Pledge Total Defence' campaign**, and co-developed **digital TD sandbox projects** such as "ScamGuard" and "Guardians of the City II" during the Polytechnic Forum 2024.



This year's **Exercise SG Ready 2025**, co-led by MINDEF and the Energy Market Authority, focused on **strengthening national readiness against power grid disruptions** caused by cyber attacks. Over 1,000 organisations took part. Several **power, food and water disruptions** were also simulated across the island, including a "blackout" of over 30 prominent buildings.



During the exercise, buildings at MINDEF HQ experienced a series of simulated power disruptions due to a simulated cyberattack, as well as a civil emergency which triggered a fire drill.

A phishing drill was also conducted by SAF C4 Command to strengthen the SAF's cyber resilience against social engineering attacks and maintain vigilance across MINDEF/SAF.

Personnel mobilisation exercises were held by the Singapore Armed Forces (SAF) at Selarang Camp and Murai Camp.

SAF units tested their business continuity plans in simulated power outages, clarified their roles and responsibilities, and identified areas of improvement.



Leveraging data and technology to reduce administrative load and better support our servicemen through their NS journey.

Enhanced OneNS App

The OneNS app offers smoother access to NS services, including ICT deferment, real-time mobilisation updates, and easier use of NS credits.



New CMPB

Opening progressively from mid-2025, the new CMPB will streamline NS administrative and medical processes – including fitness, screenings, and specialist care, while also serving the community with public exercise facilities, childcare, and dining options.

3 STRENGTHENING RECOGNITION

Recognising the contributions and sacrifices of our servicemen and their families, and supporting them in their lifecycle needs.

NS allowance to increase from 1 July 2025

NSFs will receive a 4–5% increase in monthly allowance, based on rank.

\$200 in LifeSG cash credits

Digital credits that can be used at over 100,000 online/physical stores.



All past & present NSmen to get S\$200 in LifeSG credits: Budget 2024

This includes all NSFs enlisted in and before 2024.




